5. That Yale open its facilities to the P. R. community.

6. That B. U. also take part in voting for admission of students.

7. That Yale commit itself to a specified number of new P. R. students by a specified date

We criticise point no 2 of your letter (issues to address oneself to) because it confuses issues. I talked to Eduardo about this and he can give you what our feelings were in a more detailed manner.
